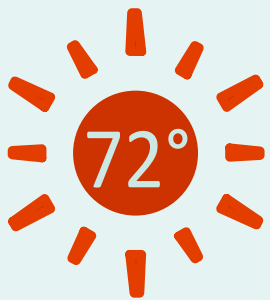


WHEN IS IT TOO HOT FOR YOUR DOG?

Every year dogs die from being left in hot cars. Many people think that leaving a window open will keep their dog safe, but studies show that an open window makes no difference. Temperatures rise quickly and in a matter of five or ten minutes on a hot day, your dog could die.



A car's temperature will rise **approximately 40°** in an hour even on a relatively cool day.*

Record information about the vehicle
(make, model, color, and license plate number)



Alert the management of the business
(they can make an announcement to find the owner)



Call the police or animal control

Stay with the dog until help arrives
