

Every year dogs die from being left in hot cars. Many people think that leaving a window open will keep their dog safe, but studies show that an open window makes no difference. Temperatures rise quickly and in a matter of five or ten minutes on a hot day, your dog could die.



A car's temperature will rise approximately 40° in an hour even on a relatively cool day.\*

- red gums and tongue
